

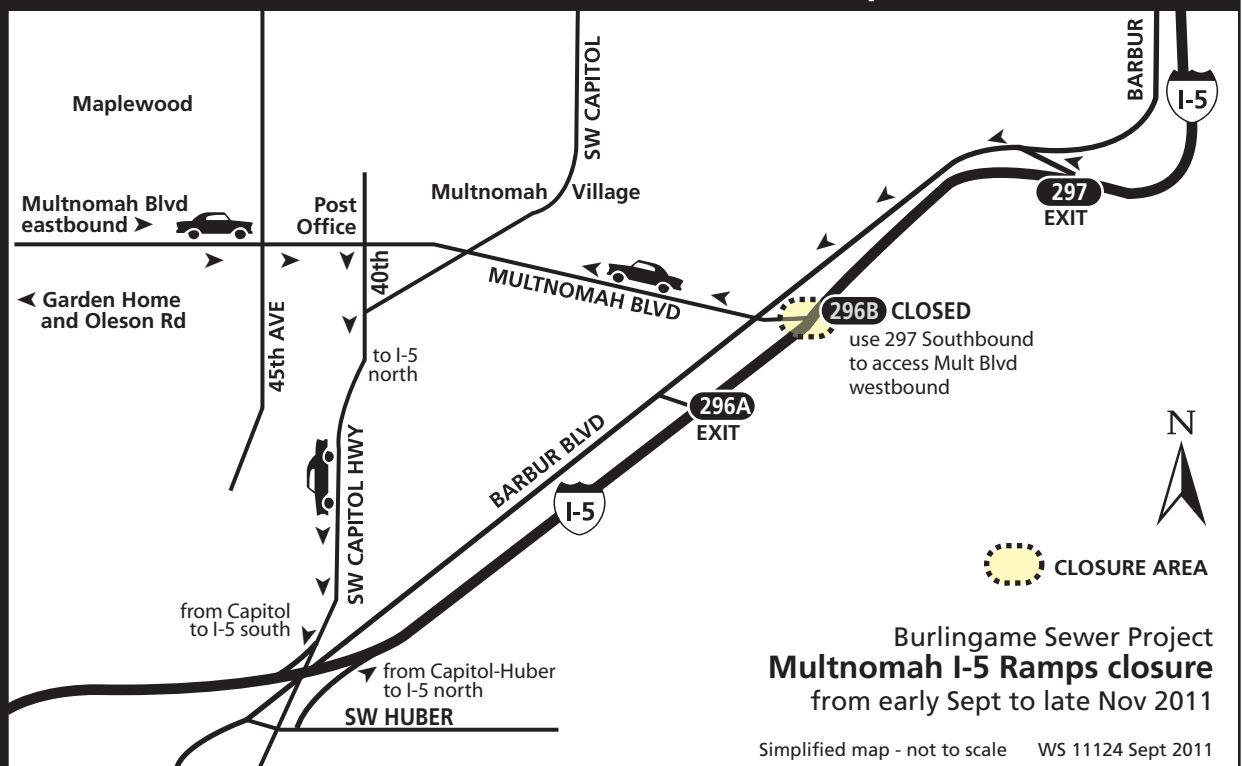

# I-5 Ramps to Close Temporarily but Multnomah is Open for Business

During Burlingame Trunk Sewer construction, SW Multnomah Boulevard will remain open. However, the exit from I-5 south to SW Multnomah Boulevard (Exit 296B) and the entrance to I-5 north from eastbound SW Multnomah Boulevard will be closed (see closure area on map) for approximately 45 days, from late September to as late as mid-November.

Signs will direct traffic to detours to and from the freeway. The local circulation generally remains the same for businesses and residents during construction. Signage and flagging will direct both regional and local traffic.

## DETOURS for I-5 Multnomah Ramps closure



If you are going south on I-5 and want to reach Multnomah Boulevard westbound  
Take Exit 297-Terwilliger/ Bertha to access Multnomah Boulevard via Barbur Boulevard.

If you are west of the closure area and want to access I-5 north - Take SW 40th  
Avenue south to SW Capitol Highway and follow signs to I-5 north at SW Huber street.

Construction of the entire Burlingame Trunk Sewer will last until summer 2012.
